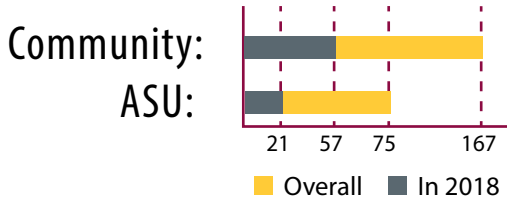

Program Highlights

- ★ October marked Project Humanities' fifth annual **Hacks for Humanity** hackathon for the social good, and our first year syncing our hackathon with another university, University of Texas at Dallas.
- ★ **Aridity and the Desert**, a grant-funded dinner and dialogue series, brought together diverse individuals and communities to *talk, listen, and connect* over a shared meal.
- ★ Our 3-day **Men2Men Conference**, co-sponsored by Tanner Chapel AME Church and First Church UCC, provided opportunity for men across the Valley to have critical conversations about issues directly related to men's lives.
- ★ Project Humanities' welcomes volunteers of all ages to participate in weekly **Friday Sorting** and bi-monthly **Service Saturdays**, where donations of clothing, toiletries, and other necessities are distributed to 150-200 adults experiencing homelessness in downtown Phoenix.
